Lt. Governor chairs 74th Meeting of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board

Lt. Governor Shri Manoj Sinha chaired the 74th Meeting of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board at Raj Bhawan on March 6, 2025.

The Board reviewed past decisions, ratified actions, and took new decisions on 20 key agenda items to improve pilgrim services. Key decisions included redeveloping Bhairon Ji Temple Complex, constructing an exit track at Bhawan and remodeling of Manokamana area.

On the sidelines of the meeting, the Lieutenant Governor inaugurated several pilgrim-centric facilities including the Queue Complex at Darshani Deodi, Banganga and the Holding Area at Adhkuwari. He also launched the 50gm and 100gm silver coins of the Board; expanding the range of facilities available to pilgrims.

The Board also approved an amnesty scheme for shop licensees and reviewed the Annual Green Plan. The LG directed the CEO to evaluate adequacy & other aspects of STPs and explore renewable energy sources. He emphasized implementing a robust feedback mechanism for service improvement and lauded the contribution of Board Members.

The Board took appraisal of peripheral institutions under the SMVD Charitable Society, including SMVD Gurukul, SMVD Narayana Superspecility Hospital, Shrine Board's Sports Complex, SMVD College of Nursing and SMVDIME-Medical College and approved grants-in-aid and financial assistance to support their functioning.

The Board observed that Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine has seen a consistent surge in devotees, with the annual pilgrimage exceeding 90 lakh for the third consecutive year, reaching an impressive 95 lakh last year. The significant growth is attributed to the dedication of major projects in the Bhawan area and the expansion of facilities and amenities in Katra and other sectors.

The meeting also reviewed the implementation of the Annual Green Plan of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board for the current year and approved the Annual Green Plan for the year 2025-26.

Dedicated Helicopter Quota for Senior Citizens and Specially-abled Pilgrims at Vaishno Devi Shrine

Shri Anshul Garg, Chief Executive Officer on January 31, 2025 held a press conference at SGC, Katra and made announcements regarding new initiatives by the Board to enhance pilgrim services. These include a dedicated online helicopter quota for senior citizens and specially-abled pilgrims, available on the board's website from February 1, 2025. He informed that the Board has also introduced Langar Sewa counters at the Yatra Facilitation Centre in Katra Railway Station and added local cuisine, Kadhi-Chawal, to the existing menu of free Langars at Adhkuwari and Bhairon Ji.

Infrastructure upgrades include the traditional Banganga track with a queue complex at Darshani Deodi accommodating 1,500 pilgrims at a time and a covered holding area at Adhkuwari.

The Shrine Board has also announced Priority Darshan for local residents based on Aadhar cards. These initiatives aim to make the pilgrimage experience smoother and more inclusive, reflecting the Shrine Board's commitment to continuously enhancing pilgrim services.

The Board has introduced various initiatives to enhance the pilgrimage experience of devotees visiting the Shrine during Chaitra the Navratra. These include smart lockers, free public call booths and complimentary slots for divyang devotees to participate in Garbjoon Arti and Atka Arti.

The Board has also set up resting and holding areas at Banganga and Adhkuwari, expanded the Inderprasth Bhojanalaya and extended the Langar facility for pilgrims by way of introduction of new Langar at Shubhra Bhawan. Dedicated quotas for helicopter bookings and complimentary battery car services have also been provided for divyang pilgrims. A special food options for catering to the devotees observing fasts during the pilgrimage were made available by the Shrine Board at its Langars as also at its and Catering outlets.

The Shrine Board has made comprehensive arrangements, including round-the-clock water and power supply, sanitation facilities and medical care along the tracks. Additionally, captivating Bhajan and Bhaint performances were held at Bhawan and Adhkuwari during morning and evening Atka arti; enriching the pilgrims' experience.

The Bhawan, Atka and surrounding areas were beautifully transformed into a spiritual oasis with grand decorations and stunning facade lights, creating a mesmerizing ambiance for devotees.

High-Level Committee holds meetings with Sangarsh Samiti over Ropeway Project

The High-Level Committee (HLC) framed by the Hon'ble Chairman, SMVDSB (Lt. Governor, JK-UT) comprising Dr. Ashok Bhan and Shri Suresh Kumar Sharma, Member of SMVDSB, Shri Ramesh Kumar, Divisional Commissioner, Jammu and Shri Anshul Garg, Chief Executive Officer, SMVDSB, held five crucial meetings with Sangarsh Samiti members and stakeholders on January 16 & 28 and March 15, 2025.

The Committee aimed to address concerns and alleviate apprehensions the Project regarding Ropeway stakeholders raising issues about preserving the traditional track's sanctity and protecting local businesses. Samiti had expressed worries about the Delhi-Amritsar-Katra expressway's impact on Katra town, urging its termination at the Inter Modal Station (IMS), Katra.

The HLC emphasized the project's potential benefits (such as enhanced pilgrim experience, increased numbers and higher spending in Katra town due to reduced turnaround times). HLC assured the stakeholders that the consultation processes shall remain ongoing and final decisions shall be taken in mutual consultation mode.

Later, Dr. Bhan expressed satisfaction with the meeting's outcome stating that it concluded on a positive note with stakeholders committing for collaborative efforts for the region's overall development. He also mentioned that the HLC shall remain open to further discussions and consultations, ensuring that all stakeholders are duly heard before any final decisions are made.

CEO Shrine Board Reiterates Commitment to Pilgrim Welfare on 76th R-Day Celebrations at Katra

The 76th Republic Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm at the Shrine Board's Sports Complex in Katra. Shri Anshul Garg, Chief Executive Officer, Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board, unfurled the national flag and took salute of impressive march-past.

Additionally, the CEO announced new upcoming facilities including Battery Car Parking, Adhkuwari holding area, Al-based CCTV cameras and establishing of a Command Control Centre.

The CEO shared that plans to establish Katra as a regional hub are underway, with projects such as development of four temples along the Trikuta Hills Parikrama Marg and an additional helipad at Katra to improve connectivity to the Shiv Khori Shrine.

The Shrine Board's social support initiatives were also highlighted including scholarships for Baridar families and the upcoming Medical College, which promises to deliver high-quality healthcare services to the region.


